

Investment in Nonprofit Arts Businesses Fiscal Year 2011 (with comparison to Fiscal Year 2010)

New Mexico Arts, the state arts agency and a division of the Department of Cultural Affairs, is a primary supporter of New Mexico's arts businesses. We invest federal and state dollars in the arts and culture economy through performing arts centers, local arts councils, arts enterprise partnerships, and folk arts apprenticeships. New Mexico Arts remains one of the state's top funders in terms of giving, and its supported programs continue to serve more individuals with significantly less public investment than the state's museums.

- In fiscal year 2011, we invested \$1,003,094 in 172 arts businesses, for an average investment of \$5,832. Total funds invested increased 2.7% over FY2010. However, the increase in number of businesses (eight or 4.9%) lowered the average investment in each business by 2%.
- Every \$1 of public funds invested by New Mexico Arts leveraged \$26 of additional income, unchanged from fiscal year 2010. Leveraged income from Bernalillo (\$18), Santa Fe (\$50), and rural counties (\$11) businesses also remained the same. However, leveraged income from Doña Ana businesses fell 41%, from \$22 in fiscal year 2010 to \$13, primarily from a drop in the contributed income of a single organization.
- Total business or program income of these arts businesses totaled almost \$27 million, 2% higher than in fiscal year 2010. Approximately half of this total income (\$13 million) was earned income, representing a 10% increase, with organizations from Bernalillo County (41%) and rural counties (16%) contributing the most gains. These gains resulted from both newly funded organizations and those with increased earned revenues.
- We funded businesses or projects in 30 of New Mexico's 33 counties in which 99.5 percent of the state's population of 2.1 million live. Only Catron, DeBaca, and Hidalgo counties were not served directly or indirectly by our investment.
- Almost 1.4 million New Mexicans benefited from these programs and services (up 19%), and nearly 319,000 youth were served (up 4%). The increase in individuals benefiting was driven primarily by Santa Fe and rural businesses, both newly funded and existing.
- The 172 arts businesses employed 1,726 paid staff (up 60%, due to large gains in Bernalillo) with average salaries of just over \$6,000 per year (down 38%), generating an average of \$15,627 of income (down 37%, primarily in urban counties). More than 12,000 professional artists were hired (up 16%, all counties posting gains except Doña Ana), with businesses paying them a total of \$16,748,991 in salaries and contracted fees.
- Many volunteers gave their time and expertise at no pay in support of these businesses. In fiscal
 year 2011, 14,469 volunteers (including board members) donated their services to yield a
 contribution valued at more than \$9.6 million (calculated at 38.9 average volunteer hours per
 resident and \$17.10 per hour value of volunteer time). This does not include additional community
 investments such as rent, equipment, and supplies.
- The businesses New Mexico Arts invested in averaged 10 paid staff, 72 professional artists served or employed, 84 volunteers, 8,085 individuals benefiting, 1,853 youth served, and a public investment of \$5,832.
