

The Art in Public Places (AIPP) Program of the New Mexico Arts Division (NMAD) as outlined by the AIPP Act (Sections 13-4A-11, NMSA 1978) has specific eligibility requirements for the witholding of One Percent for Art funds.

- 1. One percent of the total appropriation for new construction or renovation of any building shall be deposited into the Art in Public Places (AIPP) fund after the issuance of the appropriate bonds or release of general funds. (13-4A-7)
- 2. Capital Outlay appropriations of \$100,000 or less are **not eligible** for one percent. All capital outlay appropriations over \$100,000, involving construction or major renovation **are eligible**. Eligibility is confirmed by NMAD and DFA.
- 3. The maximum one percent amount for any appropriation is \$200,000.
- 4. Auxiliary buildings such as maintenance plants, correctional facilities, warehouses or temporary structures are subject to the one percent funds. (13-4A-3E) These funds are placed in the AIPP Auxiliary Fund and will be used to acquire and install artwork in existing public buildings.
- 5. The AIPP Act does not contain a definition of "new construction" or "major renovation" For clarification, policies are listed below:
 - a. If renovation is for a specific purpose such as roof repair, asbestos removal, handicap accessibility, fire sprinkler system installation, security system installation, electrical upgrades, or HVAC installation, etc., one percent does NOT apply.
 - b. If a project is for a major renovation such as converting an armory into a convention center and part of the project entails work as listed in above (section a), one percent of the total appropriation MUST be set aside for art.
 - c. Capital project requests for the purchase of a pre-fabricated building or the demolition of a building are NOT eligible for the one percent.
