

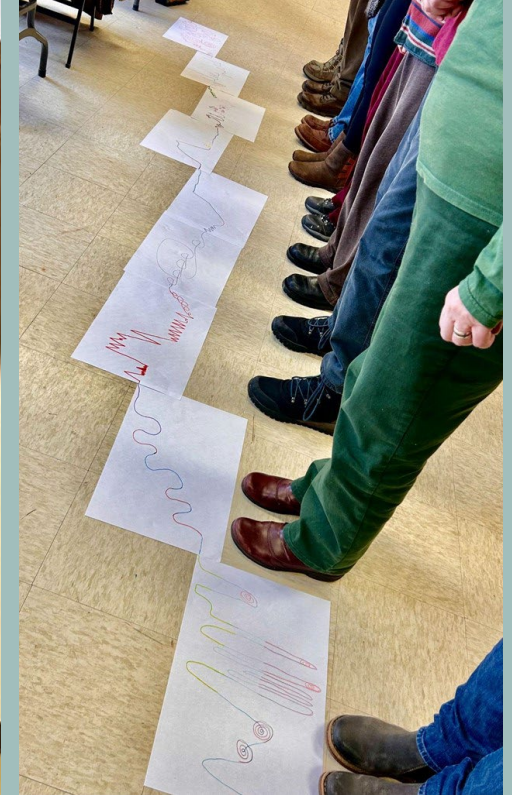

# Arts & The Military Program Goals

1. Create more opportunities for military and veteran audiences – including active-duty service members, reservists, National Guard members, veterans, their families and caregivers, and others – to meaningfully engage with the arts.
2. Build capacity among New Mexico organizations to offer arts programs for military-connected participants.

# Mini Grant Eligibility

- 501 (c) (3) tax exempt, New Mexico nonprofit organizations, units of government, schools, colleges, universities, and Indian tribal government entities.
- Organizations receiving New Mexico Arts funding in other grant programs can apply.

# Mini Grant Eligibility

## ***NEW! ADVANCE REVIEW***

- Advance review of your application is **required** *if*: your organization is a new applicant or did not receive funding for a prior application to the Mini Grant program.
- Failure to submit application for advance review will **disqualify your final application.**
- **Advance Review deadline is Sept 23, 2024.**
- **Please Note:** Organizations that have received a mini grant in the past are encouraged to submit their application for advance review if pursuing any new project ideas.

# Funding Amount

- Applicants **should** request \$2,500.
- No matching funds are required but organization may commit additional funds to the activity.
- Selected proposals will receive the full \$2,500.



# Project Implementation

**Project Activities can start anytime after:**

**January 2025\***

**and should be completed by**

**June 15, 2025.**

# Selection Criteria

Proposals will be reviewed using the following criteria:

1. Does the project create new or additional opportunities for military audiences to meaningfully engage with the arts.

*Or*

Does the project build capacity for your organization to offer arts programs in the future for military audiences.

2. Feasibility of activity or service within the timeline and organizational capacity.

3. Audience/participant recruiting and promotion strategies.

4. Appropriateness of budget.

5. Plan for evaluation that addresses specific measures of success and how they are documented.

# Proposal Requirements

# Proposal Requirements

In a single PDF document or PDF Fillable Application Form, provide a clear and concise overview of your proposed project (maximum 2 pages - Online forms have character limits)

> *Select one* <

- Does the project create new or additional opportunities for military audiences to meaningfully engage with the arts

***OR***

- does the project build capacity for your organization to offer arts programs in the future for military audiences?

# Proposal Requirements

## Overview of Proposed Project to include:

- Organizational mission statement and a brief summary of past or current organizational activities.
- Describe your project goal(s).
- Who will be your primary audience?
- Describe how you intend to reach primary audience or highlight existing relationships with military connected audiences.
- What is the timeline of planned activities and where will they take place?
- List key project artists or staff with their relevant experience and roles in relation to the proposed project. List any community partners? What are their roles?
- Provide a project budget showing how New Mexico Arts funds will be used and any other project funding (please review eligible listed above).
- How will you measure the success of your project?

# Types of Activity Support

- **Learning-Based Arts Projects**
- **Capacity Building Projects**

Projects can be new or ongoing but cannot end before the submission of an application.

# Type of Activity Supported

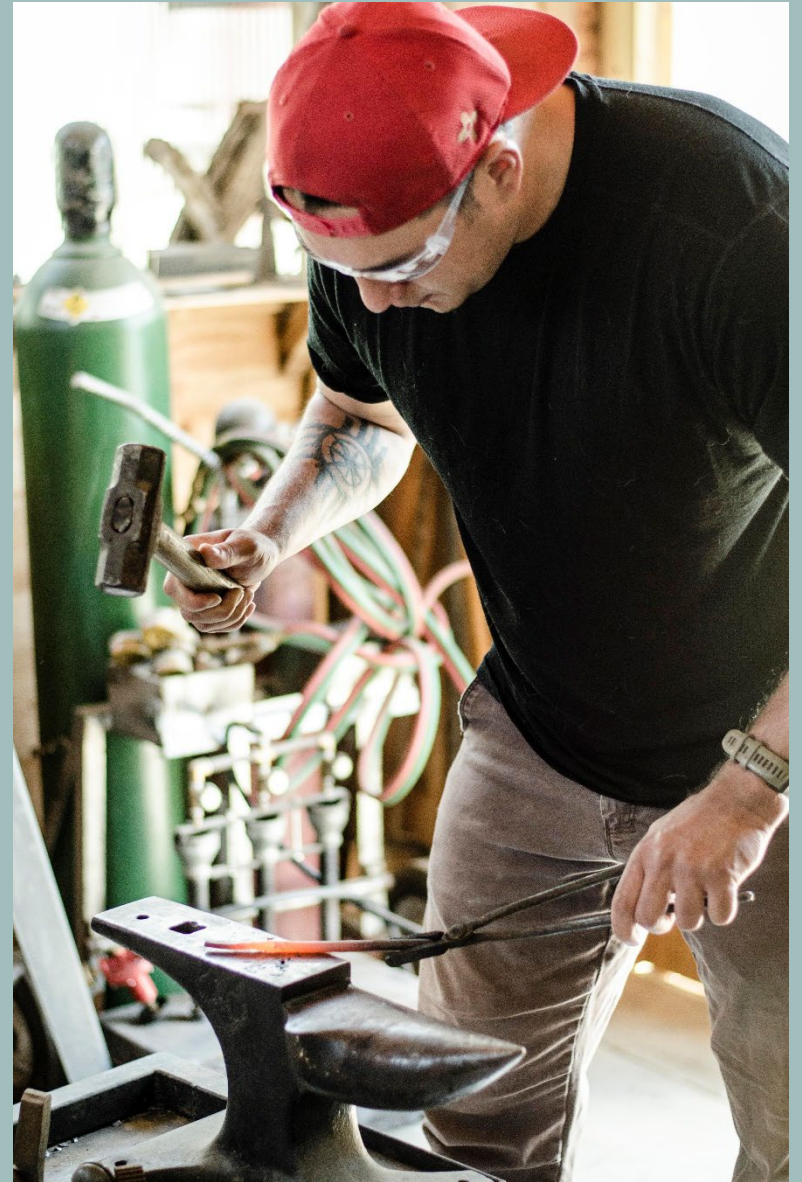
## Learning-Based Arts Projects

- Classes and workshops (frequency and duration may vary).
- Online/virtual learning-based arts programs.

# Type of Activity Supported

## Capacity Building Projects

Projects that increase an organization's capacity to provide arts experiences and programming to military-connected audiences, including but not limited to:

- Professional development opportunities
- Contracted consultant services
- Research, development, and program evaluation expenses

# Types of Allowable Expenses

*Funding from New Mexico Arts and the Military Grants can be used toward the following expenses:*

- Artistic, administrative, and technical fees
- Consultant and facilitator fees
- Consumable supplies
- Marketing expenses
- Rental fees
- Artist travel fee

# Types of Ineligible Expenses

*New Mexico Arts cannot fund the following expenses:*

- Any events or activities already listed as part of another organization's application
- Projects or organizations (including fiscal agents) outside of the State of New Mexico
- Investment or contingency funding (i.e., accounts earning interest)
- Direct aid to individuals, including fellowships, scholarships, cash prizes, or awards
- Projects that have already occurred
- Projects in which school, college, or university course credit is the primary purpose
- Projects whose main purpose is recreational
- Cost of parties, receptions, fund-raising events, and other social functions
- Grant writing, solicitation of gifts/services, and donor appreciation programs
- Any food except when food is part of a per diem

# Types of Ineligible Expenses

*New Mexico Arts cannot fund the following expenses:*

- Deficit reduction
- Negotiated indirect costs
- Projects in which commissions/ acquisitions of permanent works of visual art are the primary purpose
- Permanent acquisitions (i.e., buildings or land)
- Capital Improvements, new construction, renovation, or conservation
- Capital supplies & equipment such as copy machines, musical instruments, electronic equipment, computers, etc.
- Requests that fund other divisions, foundations, or employees and contractors of the Department of Cultural Affairs or members of the New Mexico Arts Commission

# Mini Grant Timeline

## DEADLINES

- Application for advance review deadline:

**Sept 23, 2024\***

- Mini Grant final application deadline:

**5pm (MST) November 8, 2024.**

*\* Failure to submit application for advance review will  
disqualify your final application*

# Timeline

- Advance Review Deadline: September 23, 2024
- **Final Deadline: 5pm (MST) November 8, 2024.**
- Award Notification: December 2, 2024
- Project Activities should occur between January 2025 and June 15, 2025.
- Final Report and Invoice submitted to New Mexico Arts by June 15, 2025.
