### FY27 GRANT RENEWAL GUIDE

The **FY27** Renewal Application is open for eligible applicants who were awarded funding in FY26. The Renewal Application is a short update in which you will submit information about proposed FY27 activities. If you received a score of 65 or above in FY26, you are eligible to submit a Renewal Application. Regardless of whether you accepted your FY26 funding, you must submit a Renewal Application to be considered for funding for FY27.

**FY27** funded activities should have a public presentation component that takes place during the state fiscal year from July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027, most funded programs will have a May 31, Term Date, by which all funded programs must be completed.

### REIMBURSEMENT

Funding from New Mexico Arts is on a reimbursement basis. New Mexico Arts cannot reimburse programming expenses until the grant agreement has been approved by the State Department of Finance and Administration.

### **FINAL REPORT**

A Final Report must be submitted by the funded organization by the receipt deadline stipulated in the agreement. Failure to submit required reports may jeopardize future funding from New Mexico Arts.


**Notification & Agreements** 

All FY27 applicants will request a fixed grant amount of \$10,000. Funding for FY27 will be allocated based on available funding and the FY26 panel score; full funding is not to be expected but rather a percentage of available funding. The maximum request of \$10,000 is intended to create a more equitable distribution of funds across all funding categories serving small and large organizations, and those in rural and urban communities.

Request must include a 50% match by the applicant organization, at least half of which must be cash.

# ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Limited to one application per organization/institution.
- Have been awarded funding in FY26
- Have a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI). All organizations who apply to New Mexico Arts are required
  to have a UEI from SAM.gov in alignment with requirements for the National Endowment for the
  Arts. (Please see SAM.gov, https://sam.gov Once assigned, the UEI number will never expire;
  however, entity registrations do expire annually & require annual renewal.)
- Complete FY27 renewal application must be submitted online by the published deadline of 11:59
   PM MT, December 12, 2025.
- Upload renewal application FY27 Budget Detail.
- Have on file in their organization's online account a 501(c)(3) IRS Tax-Exempt Determination
  Letter granting them tax-exempt status which includes the Federal Employer Identification
  Number (FEIN) (does not apply to public schools and government entities). Applicants using a
  fiscal agent must submit the letter for the fiscal agent which includes the fiscal agent's FEIN.
- Meet the eligibility requirements of a funding category.



### GENERAL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS

### Funding from New Mexico Arts cannot be used for the following:

- Any events or activities already listed as part of another organization's application.
- Projects or organizations (including fiscal agents) outside of the State of New Mexico
- Investment or contingency funding (i.e., accounts earning interest).
- Direct aid to individuals, including fellowships, scholarships, cash prizes, or awards.
- Projects that have already occurred.
- Projects in which school, college, or university course credit is the primary purpose.
- Projects whose main purpose is recreational.
- Projects whose primary purpose is the re-staging of historical events, such as re-enactments, mountain men gatherings, etc.
- Cost of parties, receptions, fund-raising events, and other social functions.
- Grant writing, solicitation of gifts/services, and donor appreciation programs.
- Any food except when food is part of a per diem.
- Deficit reduction.
- Negotiated indirect costs.
- Projects in which commissions/acquisitions of permanent works of visual art are the primary purpose; contact New Mexico Arts to discuss your project's purpose to determine eligibility.
- Permanent acquisitions (i.e., buildings or land).
- Capital improvements, new construction, renovation, or conservation.
- Capital supplies & equipment such as copy machines, musical instruments, electronic equipment, computers, etc.
- Requests that fund other divisions, foundations, or employees and contractors
  of the Department of Cultural Affairs or members of the New Mexico Arts Commission.
- Rent or fees for facilities owned by the DCA.
- National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) direct funds, TourWest funds through the Western States Arts Federation (WESTAF), and other Federal funds cannot be used as a cash match for New Mexico Arts funded projects.
